

#CBITexas set for San Antonio Riverwalk

The 411... CBI files FCC comments on indecency

In early August, CBI filed comments on behalf of FCC-licensed student radio stations in response to the FCC's request for public comment on adopting an egregious cases policy for broadcast indecency. CBI collected more than 100 comments from member and non-member stations regarding their existing station policies regarding indecency and the impact an indecency fine could have on station operations.

The comments supported the Commission treating expletives in a manner consistent with its earlier *Pacifica* ruling to reduce uncertainty for broadcast licensees, the public, and the Commission, and avoid both the constitutional issues and thus minimize the chilling effect that resulted from the Golden Globes enforcement policy.

CBI's comments also supported the FCC using its recent policy statement concerning first time offenses in the case of William Penn University (Docket No. DA 13-1074) as the basis to adopt a similar policy regarding indecency violations by educational radio stations.

WMUL manager inducted into hall of fame

Dr. Charles G. "Chuck" Bailey, faculty manager of WMUL-FM at Marshall University, has been selected as a 2013 inductee to the West Virginia Broadcasting Hall of Fame.

Since 1985, WMUL has won more than 1,000 awards under Bailey's advisement, including Outstanding College Radio Station from the Marconi College Radio Awards and numerous CBI National Student Production Awards.

Bailey received the Lifetime Achievement award from the West Virginia Associated Press Broadcasters Association in 2007, the John Marshall Award for Extraordinary Service to West Virginia Higher Education in 2000 and a College Media Advisers Distinguished Four-year Broadcast Adviser award in 1995.
