## National Student Production Awards accepted through May 9

Submissions for College Broadcasters, Inc.'s annual National Student Production Awards are open. Now in its 13th year, the awards honor outstanding student work in 24 categories. More than 100 radio and television stations submitted a combined 700 entries in the 2013 contest and even more are expected for 2014.

Best Social Media Presence makes its debut in the contest, judging the best use of platforms like Facebook, Twitter and Instagram by a station over the past year. Up to two entries can be submitted per station per category. All submissions are free for CBI member stations and \$65 per entry for non-members.
