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**CBI HOSTS SUCCESSFUL 2014 NATIONAL
STUDENT ELECTRONIC MEDIA CONVENTION**

College Broadcasters, Inc. (CBI) hosted the 3rd annual National Student Electronic Media Convention (NSEMC) at the Renaissance Seattle hotel from Oct. 23-25. The NSEMC is America's top convention dedicated exclusively to the interests of student TV/video outlets, radio stations, and webcasters.

This year's convention set new highs with nearly 500 registered attendees and more than 100 breakout sessions, focusing on a wide variety of subjects ranging from technical and legal training to management and leadership topics. Other highlights included tours of local radio and television facilities, a keynote address by Emmy award winning Seattle broadcaster John Curley, and presentation of the National Student Production Awards.

"This year's convention was the best one we've ever held," says CBI President Greg Weston. "The feedback has been incredibly positive. We'd like to thank our members, attendees, and sponsors for their part in making this such a success. Still, we're confident that our 2015 convention will be even better."
